Notifications for the juried show applicants have gone out and by now everyone should know if their work(s) were accepted.

Art in the Park will resume this month, 4/11-12 at Chapin Park and 4/18-19 at Valor Park.

The Board met after the last general meeting. As not enough members had made a commitment to the gallery, it was decided to issue one last call for artists before making a decision as to whether to proceed with the project. The deadline was March 31st.

One of WACG's concerns is encouraging young artists leading us to discuss this year's scholarship efforts. For the past few years we have been providing scholarships for a middle and high school student to attend CCU's summer art camp, however that program has been discontinued. In its place, we are considering an annual

scholarship for a graduating high school senior who wishes to pursue visual arts. More on that later.

Looking Back

After a successful outdoor show at the Myrtle Beach Convention Center during the Sun Fun Festival in June 1969, the WACG turned its efforts to sponsoring the first ever fall show, an "Arts & Crafts Christmas Bazaar". It was held November 22-24 at the SC Public Service Authority Auditorium on Oak Street.

The show featured works by professional artists such as Pete Przekop, Jimmy Garrison, Larry Boulier, Elizabeth Roberts, Alex Powers, and Martha Thomas. Many amateur painters and sculptors also participated.

Everything was for sale, from embroidered felt book marks (20 cents each) to paintings priced in the hundreds of dollars. Most artists, however, offered numerous small, affordable pieces to fit holiday budgets.

During the bazaar, Gus Oesterlund played an electric organ to entertain the crowds, and Alex Powers did onthe-spot portraits of attendees, according to newspaper accounts.

Art In Our Area

The Franklin G. Burroughs – Simeon B. Chapin Art Museum has two exhibits available for viewing from now until April 23rd.

Swim: An Artist's Journey by Charles Williams centers around the life-altering, near-drowning experience of this African American artist and Georgetown, SC native. The show includes 8 large oil paintings and 40 small painted studies. His works address conflicting emotions aroused by the ocean: alluring yet mysterious, and at times overwhelming. In his works he confronts his own fears as well as the cultural and psychological barriers to swimming experienced by black youth.

Voices of the Island: The Cuban Art Collection of Reynier Llanes Reynier Llanes is an artist, curator and passionate art collector who has assembled a collection of paintings by mid-career contemporary, professional artists (himself included) from Pinar del Rio, a unique multicultural region of Cuba. The exhibit includes drawings and paintings in a multitude of styles such as abstraction, magic realism, and representational landscapes and still lifes.

Art Fields, a festival in Lake City, SC is a nine day event (April 25th – May 2nd) that transforms the town into a large art gallery. It will feature artists from twelve southeastern states. Selected artists compete for a share of \$100,000 in prizes. The festival was founded in 2013 as a charitable program of the Lake City Partnership Council. It has become one of the largest art shows in South Carolina. If you have not been to this event you have certainly missed a chance to see some unusual and interesting works of art.
