Bits From The Board

After a wonderful presentation by CCU photographer Armon Means, the Board met briefly to discuss a number of matters including the possibility of a new gallery at Myrtle Beach Mall. We are currently awaiting information about utility costs so we can calculate the likely cost per exhibitor. Once that is established we can move further on the project.

With regard to the Guild finances, members discussed possible ways to boost income. We currently operate at a slight yearly deficit and would like to correct the situation.

Show/Communications Director Tom Britton updated us on the Juried Spring Show at the Art Museum. Our newly designed 2015 rack cards have been distributed throughout the Grand Strand and at Visitor Centers.

We have set a date to begin digitizing Guild records. This will be done at CCU under the direction of Dr. Larry Bunch. We hope to complete the process in the next few months. Many of our old documents are deteriorating, and as the oldest art guild in the area, our history is of importance to the Grand Strand arts history.

Waccamaw Arts and Crafts Guild will have a booth at the Myrtle Beach Home Show this month, and Art in the Park kicks off a new season in April. Hope to see everyone out and about.

In The Beginning...

The Waccamaw Arts and Crafts Guild was born in February of 1969 after an informal chat over coffee at Skip's Kitchen restaurant. Landscape artist and gallery owner Larry Boulter and others later met at Horry Tech and founded the guild with 32 charter members. The association was named by John Woodruff.

The original purpose of WACG was "to correct a cultural deficiency in fine arts in Horry County", and membership was open to all who loved the arts, not just artists and craftsmen.

The Guild was tasked with providing encouragement and support to local artists by offering meetings, workshops, and shows. The group also intended to provide further training for art students and had a long term goal of building an arts center for the county.

Membership

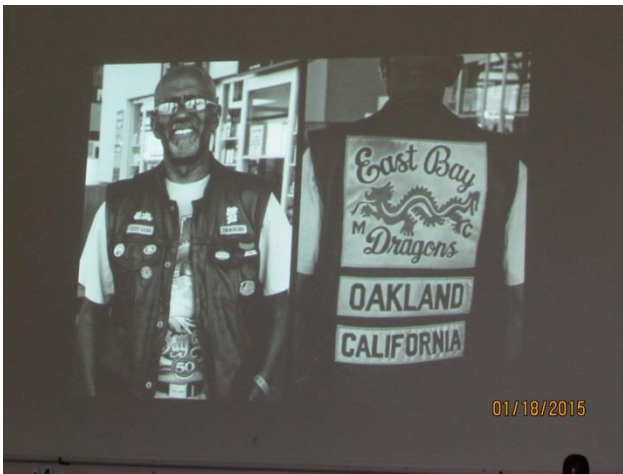

Meetings

For our January speaker we had **Armon Means** who is currently an Assistant Professor of Photography at Coastal Carolina University. He has been an exhibiting fine art photographer and educator since 2003. Areas of instruction include all levels of photography, alternative



process techniques, history of photography, and art survey/appreciation. He has exhibited widely in group exhibitions in France, Hungary and numerous eastern and midwestern states. His work centers on ideas of cultural concerns, minority identity, and environmental influences and is represented in multiple collections across the United States and Germany. His program was interesting and entertaining.

Our **February** program will feature **Cat Taylor** who is an instructor of visual arts and the Foundations Coordinator at Coastal Carolina University. He was born in Florence, SC, received his BA from Coastal Carolina University, and his MFA from Savannah College of Art and Design. He has done

portraits for such noted people as the Arch Bishop Desmond Tutu and Nelson Mandela, and he is a member of the National Portrait Society.

His program should be interesting and informative for all. So plan on joining us at the Art Museum on Sunday, February 15, 2015 at 1:30 PM. Cat is going to bring a selection of his works to share and discuss.

Looking ahead, our March program will be presented by Claudia E. Dominguez. Claudia is a painter and fabric artist. She is also an associate faculty member at Coastal Carolina University. This should be an interesting program.

February 12th to March 11th the Waccamaw Mall Show. This show will be for large and expensive works (\$500 - \$5,000+). This show has been announced about 2 weeks ahead of the opening date. Investors have renovated the old Waccamaw Pottery Facility and they are offering members of our art community an opportunity to sell their art. The owner has offered an 8000 square foot facility for use as a gallery. So far, 5 well known Chinese Artists will be displaying 36 large pieces for the show, which leaves a lot of space for artists to display.

There is no fee to participate, however, there will be a 40% commission on all sales (price accordingly). You must submit a photo of each piece that you wish to you enter into the show for consideration. If accepted, the work must be:

Minimum size 18 x 24.

Price \$500 - \$5000 (or more).

All work must be framed.

Frames must be new or in like new condition (no defects).

No Gallery Wraps or Cheap Metal Frames.

No plastic or pressed wood frames (no exceptions).

No items that have recently been displayed at a lower price with no significant changes.

Bigger is better...there will only be about 200 pieces in this 8000 SF facility.

Open to 2-D works and sculpture.

Art In Our Area

The Franklin G. Burroughs – Simeon B. Chapin Art Museum has two exhibits available for viewing from now until April 23rd.

Swim: An Artist's Journey by **Charles Williams** centers around the life-altering, near-drowning experience of this African American artist and Georgetown, SC native. The show includes 8 large oil paintings and 40 small painted studies. His works address conflicting emotions aroused by the ocean: alluring yet mysterious, and at times overwhelming. In his works he confronts his own fears as well as the cultural and psychological barriers to swimming experienced by black youth.

Voices of the Island: The Cuban Art Collection of Reynier Lianes

The Burroughs and Chapin Art Museum is having the Fourth Annual Collector's Event at

the Collector's Café in Myrtle Beach on February 22, 2015. This event is \$100 per ticket and each ticket-holder attending will take home a work of art valued at \$100 or more. Some of our artists have donated art works for this event. This is a fundraiser for the museum and we encourage our members to attend and help support the museum.

The Art Muesum is celebrating the **Chinese New Year, The Year of the Ram**. They are hosting a **Free Family Day** on Saturday, **February 7th, from 11:00 AM to 3:00 PM**. There will be activities for all ages including a parade, Chinese story-telling, ice sculpting, vegetable carving, tai chi, tai cong, martial arts, traditional Chinese dancing. Participants will enjoy a Collaborative Handprint Dragon mural, New Year Drums, paper lanterns, Ram, Lion and Dragon masks, kites, face painting, paper folding and cutting. They are also offering chopstick lessons and noodle tasting, tea, rice cakes, and fortune cookies. There will be Mah Jong, Dominoes, and Chinese Checkers. There will be a Chinese Culture Display and Chinese New Year Videos. It should be a lot of fun for all who attend. A great opportunity for a very special, and educational, family outing.

Art Fields, a festival in Lake City, SC is a nine day event that transforms the town into a large art gallery. It will take place in April featuring artists from twelve southeastern states. Selected artists compete for a share of \$100,000 in prizes. The festival was founded in 2013 as a charitable program of the Lake City Partnership Council. It was designed to provide opportunities for artists, educational programs and arts programs for the public. It has become one of the largest art shows in South Carolina. If you have not been to this event you have certainly missed a

chance to see some unusual and interesting works of art.

A Call For Help
