The Myrtle Beach Art Museum "The Art of the Brick" Saturday, June 11 - Saturday, September 10, 2016

The Art of the Brick is a global-touring, one-of-a-kind LEGO art exhibition featuring the large-scale sculptures created out of iconic LEGO bricks by contemporary artist Nathan Sawaya. Award-winning artist Sawaya has catapulted the iconic LEGO brick into an art medium all its own, transforming this construction toy into awe-inspiring and thought-provoking sculptures.

Concurrently on display at the Art Museum for the run of the exhibition will be Sawaya's unique multimedia collaboration with award-winning Australian photographer Dean West, entitled *In Pieces. In Pieces* features a collection of visually stunning, hyperrealistic images that are exhibited with corresponding and complimentary three-dimensional LEGO sculptures.

The Art of the Brick is being presented for the first time in South Carolina and will be featured in all 11 galleries of the Art Museum.
