We always thoroughly enjoy these visits set up by CCU's Dr. Larry Bunch. The programs this year have been wonderfully diverse and it is so good to share mutual interests and learn new things.

Show and Communications Director Tom Britton made a special request that those wishing to submit work for the juried show please take time to fill the application out correctly. His organizing of shows is very complex and demanding and incorrect information slows the process. This year is special in that it is the 20th to be held at the Museum and we hope to have many wonderful pieces on display.

Eleven artists have indicated an interest in participating in our booth at the Home Show this month. Ten percent of sales goes to the Guild to help pay for speakers, supplies, etc. It's also a lot of fun to meet people and make friends for the arts in our area.

After the general meeting the Board met to discuss finances. We will be consulting with financial advisors in the next few weeks to consider a way to get more bang for our buck. Escalating expenses, particularly shows, are a drain on our treasury. While we have instituted many cost cutting measures, we must do much more to put ourselves on a sound financial footing.

Much has been done to modernize and build the Guild over the past several years, but more needs to be done and we could use all the new ideas and energy we can get!

Kathy Britton and I delivered the art supplies members so generously donated to the Boys and Girls Club of MB. They were appreciative of the donation, and it helps fulfil one of our missions, that of encouraging arts in the community. Thanks to all who contributed.

Finally, we are updating and streamlining the website.

Cozbi Cabrera painted just over 20
illustrations to accompany McKissack's prose for the children's book Stitchin' and Pullin' a Gee's Bend Quilt. These colorful, heartwarming works of art, exhibited alongside a

variety of Cabrera's famous hand-made dolls and quilts, will provide a fun and engaging atmosphere for visitors to experience the wonder that is the Gee's Bend phenomenon.

### GEE'S BEND | FROM QUILTS TO PRINTS

December 8, 2016 - April 23, 2017 Since their first appearance at the Museum of Fine Arts, Houston in 2002, the guilts of Gee's Bend have been the subject of national critical acclaim and popularity, not least demonstrated by their appearance on the US postage stamp in 2006. Made by multiple generations of African-American women from the isolated, rural community of Gee's Bend (now Boykin), Alabama, these quilts have been compared to the likes of high modernist paintings, as well as improvisational jazz. With their innovative compositions of bold patterns, colors and textures, these masterful quilts continue to occupy the imagination of the American public.

The focus of *Gee's Bend: From Quilts to Prints* is on a series of limited edition prints – more specifically, fine art etchings – designed by four of the Gee's Bend quilt makers and produced in collaboration with Paulson Bott Press in Berkeley, CA. Seen side by side with some of the famous quilts of Gee's Bend, these prints open up new conversations about the translation of ideas between one artistic medium to another.

# One More Thing ...

Remember the deadline for entry in the Spring Juried Show is coming up March 1<sup>st</sup>. You should be working on your masterpiece getting ready for the show. Also, you DO NOT have to wait until March 1<sup>st</sup> to put your entry in the mail. I need the entries as soon as possible so I can start preparing for the jury process. Remember, anything postmarked after March 1<sup>st</sup> will not be accepted.

Be sure to include a good quality 4x6 photo of your work and a nice neat Bio as it will be part of the museum's book and it will be on display during the show. Also, your photo is used to jury the work.

This will be our 20<sup>th</sup> show at the museum so this will certainly be special. Good Luck.
