Bits from the Board

Even though the Guild does not hold general meetings through the summer, the Board meets every third Sunday at the Art Museum. These meetings are open to all.

At the June 11th meeting, we reviewed our finances and noted that our investments are an improvement over the CD interest rates that we had been getting. Tom Britton, Show and Communications Director, provided an overview of the recent Juried Show. These shows continue to be a drain on our treasury, however, Tom has managed to cut costs so the bite isn't quite as big. It was decided that next year's show did not require print advertising, a major cost.

Despite the rosier financial outlook, money is, as always with non-profits, a major concern. The Board considered ways to earn money through sales of mini art works at the next members show. Natalie is looking into the use of "zapplication" as a cost effective measure for the Guild to use for art in the park and shows.

WACG recently earned money through renting out grids for the Surf's Up art and beach music show in Surfside Beach. The event went well and several sales were made. It was interesting to see how many artists were actively involved in helping to set up and take

down the show, in contrast to many Guild events in which far too many sit on their hands while a few do the work, This is not healthy for any organization. You have a chance to become more involved on July 22nd at the Surfside Library, 10-1, when Natalie will do a workshop about effective Board training.

Sharon reported on this year's scholarship recipient, and the Board discussed whether our youth outreach would better be served by identifying and supplying needy school art programs. Few high school students are even bothering to apply for the scholarships. A final decision will be made at our July meeting.

Larry has retired from CCU but will continue to set up our programs, which have been wonderful. Please let us know what kinds of programs, workshops would be of value to you.

We also felt a need to continue updating the bylaws as the summer goes on.

Have a grand summer, and please try to become more involved in the nuts and bolts of Guild activities.
