## Monthly Meeting

It is September, time to start having our monthly meetings at the Art Museum. The next meeting will be at 1:30 pm on Sunday September 17<sup>th</sup>. A Board meeting will be held at the museum following the general meeting. Board meetings are open to the public.

Our speaker for September is Kendall Martin. Kendall received her B.A. in Art History from the University of North Carolina at Wilmington and her M.A. in Art History from the School of Art and Design at West Virginia University.



Her area of specialization is Modern art with a concentration in American Modernism during the 1930s and 40s exploring the Public Works of Art Project (PWAP) and the Works Progress Administration (WPA). Her current research is focused on the influence of the American Scene in PWAP and WPA murals in the Southeast and is examining how America

cultivated its own Modern aesthetic through the use of these programs.

As an Art Historian, my job is preserving artistic traditions while observing a new generation who is making their mark on the art world. I am passionate about all aspects of art and continue to be excited for the future of art and art history."

Martin is currently teaching at Cape Fear Community College, Central Carolina Technical College, and York Technical College. She also guest lectures at Seacoast Artist Guild.

Martin's presentation topic for the September meeting is entitled *Sculptures and the Rebels Who Made Them.* Within this lecture Martin will explore sculptures from the prehistoric era to today.

# Mini Masterpieces Fundraiser

October 19-28, 2017 Seacoast Artists Gallery - The Market Common 3032 Nevers Street, Myrtle Beach, SC

In addition to the Fall Member's Show, a unique fund-raising opportunity presents itself. Guild members are invited to submit up to 5 small original 2-D (including digital art and photography) or 3-D art works. Each piece must *not exceed 12 inches in any direction*.

- The 12" maximum size includes framing or pedestals/bases for 3-D work. Matted originals are accepted (12" or less, including the mat in any direction) but must be enclosed in protective sleeves.
- All 2-D art must be wired and ready to hang. Some very small 2-D pieces may be displayed using small table top easels, but the total display size which includes the easel must not exceed 12"
- 3-D pieces must be ready for display. If needed, please provide the base or pedestal for each item – all included in the total size for each piece, not to exceed 12"
- Provide your own labels for each art work to include: artist's name, title, medium, and price.

Proceeds from the sale of "Mini Masterpieces" will be split 50/50 between the guild and the artist. The fifty percent (50%) of each sale going to the Guild will be used to help cover Guild show expenses and programs. The *Mini Masterpieces* will be displayed and sold in a separate specified area of the Seacoast Artists Gallery during the time period of the WACG Annual Members' Judged Show. This show is not a part of the Members' Judged Show.

Deliver artwork to the gallery Wednesday October 18 from 8am to 12 noon. Pick up your work on Saturday, October 29 between 9am and 12 noon. It is your responsibility to deliver and pick up your work on time. The gallery cannot store your art! Interested? Have questions?
