After accumulating a stash of fabric and a sewing machine I dove into all aspects of quilting but quickly moved beyond traditional quilting. I developed my own unique artistic

style collaging fabric, paper, digital images to express my life and experiences.

Now I find myself moving away from fabric into mixed media occasionally but every day I find myself sitting for hours at my computer or iPad working on digital art. I love breaking an image and making something totally new.

Garden City writer and illustrator Phil La Borie first became interested in apparent realities years ago when he learned of an 18th-century argument between Irish philosopher Bishop George Berkeley (1685 – 1783) and English writer Dr. Samuel Johnson (1709 – 1784). Berkeley held that reality was something that existed only in our minds, while Johnson argued that all human knowledge is based on experience. Regardless of what side of the argument one agrees with, La Borie recognizes that there are interesting and humorous opportunities for artistic expression to illustrate this and like controversies.

# Exploring Watercolor Monoprints Cameron Art Museum Wilmington NC

Monoprinting is a hand-printing technique that, unlike other methods of printing (e.g. screenprinting, linoprinting, wood cut), can only produce one copy of an image. This helps make the result look printed, yet completely unique at the same time. We will use rough-surface plexiglass and mylar film to produce original watercolor paintings that can be mono-printed onto watercolor paper. Our finished images can then be used to make Xerox copy notecards.
