Kate Lagaly Bio



Printing is done using a ultra high resolution Epson 44" 9900 Pro Printer with 11 different archival UltraChrome HDR pigment inks on Epson Signature Worthy canvas and papers. The process produces fine detail giclee prints with the widest possible color gamut. Paper prints can be taken home same day; canvas prints require 3 days to process. Epson papers/canvas used: Exhibition Canvas, Enhanced Matte, Cold Press, Hot Press, Watercolor, and Velvet. All archival. Prints as wide as 42" by 80", file size permitting. Largest so far, a canvas 33" by 78". Prefer files be submitted in either psd or tif format (more data the better). I have the capability to scan/photo existing artwork into a digital file, sometimes a lengthy process.

Fall Show

About our judge for the fall show -

Susan Casey Scharling has been a professional portrait artist for 30 years. Born in New Jersey, a

graduate of Virginia Tech, and married to an Army Officer, she taught art at Fort Campbell, Kentucky. However, frequent moves encouraged her to concentrate on her own painting. A self-taught portrait artist, Susan developed her skills through continuing education classes and workshopsincluding Charleston artist Mary Whyte and New York artist Paul McCormack. While raising her two daughters (her favorite models) Susan entered local juried competitions and exhibits, becoming an active member of the Fayetteville Art League and Art Guild. Persistence paid off and her portraits drew attention. Susan feels that people make very interesting subjects, especially when painted using dramatic light and glowing color.

Her watercolor painting of "Little Sun Worshiper" (a little girl with outstretched arms kneeling in the surf) won Best in Show at the Wilmington Art Association's annual juried exhibit. The painting was later "enlarged" to grace the billboard at the bridge leading to Holden Beach. Working in both watercolor and oils, Susan has painted hundreds of portraits through the years – mostly commissions by word of mouth. She feels she is just beginning to hit her stride. "Retired" at Holden Beach, NC – Susan spends each day painting in her studio and walking the beach with her husband, Bob, and their Golden Retriever, Waverly.
