We discussed finances, including news that our shows continue to lose approximately \$2000 each, with outgoing funds going to awards, rental and refreshment fees, and supplies. This is despite the intake of fees for the show. Our grants committee has met to fulfill requirements of the SC Arts Commission, and Kathy and Tom Britton have constant communication about investments. The latter activities are in an effort to keep us afloat.

Larry Bunch is working on having a memorial plaque made in memory of our late Board Member, Judy Churchfield, who left a large gift of art supplies to the Academy of Arts and Science. This plaque will be hung at the Academy. Sharon Sorrels advised that she is continuing to work with the Seacoast Artist Guild to offer a teacher's workshop next summer. Our next sponsored event is the MB Home Show; Tom Britton will send out word when it is time to apply to participate.

Lorraine (Lori) Dauphin moved to Myrtle Beach from Connecticut with her husband Roland, fourteen years ago. Lori has been drawing and painting from nature since childhood. She earned an Associate's Degree in graphic design/illustration at the Art Institute of Boston and spent several years as assistant Art Director for Davis & Geck.

As a successful freelance designer and illustrator since 1994, she has integrated her pastel drawings into several design projects, and has appeared in The Directory of Illustration. Lori's pastels and oils also hang in businesses, private homes and small galleries throughout the Northeast and South Carolina including William H. Miller Gallery & Seacoast Artists Gallery. Ms. Dauphin was hired by an architectural firm to paint a large triptych painting for the main dining room of their client, Tupelo Honey, here in Myrtle Beach. Lori's oil paintings have been accepted into ARTFIELDS, juried competition, in Lake City, SC three of the last four years. In spring of 2019 Lori won First Place honors in a juried show at Seacoast Artist Gallery Spring Show and Best in Show at the 2019 Waccamaw Annual Arts and Crafts 22nd Annual Juried Show exhibited at The Myrtle Beach Museum. Recently, Lori was selected to be the very first recipient of the Judy Churchfield Watercolor Award for her painting "Rowland", which was exhibited in the 2019 Waccamaw Arts and Crafts Guild's Judged Members Show held at Seacoast Artists Gallery.

Myrtle Beach Art Maseam Collection Connections – A Visual Exploration of Southern Heritage. 9/10 – April 2020

Collection Connections | A Visual Exploration of Southern Heritage is an exhibition of approximately 40 works from the Art Museum's rich permanent collections, including antique maps and historical prints, works on paper by Southern artists, including William H. Clarke, Cassandra Gillens and Jonathan Green, fabric quilts and photographs. Using Southern-historythemed works of art from our collections, the exhibition uses the visual arts to teach and explore the history and culture of South Carolina and our entire region and is designed for both school students and adults alike.

Betsy Havens - Congregate

9/19 - 12/15/19

Betsy Havens of Georgetown, SC, grew up in Savannah, GA, where at age 12, she began her study and love of art at the Telfair Museum of Art. Educated at the University of Georgia and the University of South Carolina, Havens received a Bachelor of Arts in Design and completed postgraduate studies in the history of architecture and Southern literature. She lived and worked in Columbia, SC, for 30 years, opening a studio with her now husband, James Calk, in 1998. In 2002, the couple sold their businesses and relocated to their riverfront home in Georgetown, where they faithfully devote their time and energy to their art.

Congregate speaks to the common thread in Havens' work, the human figure. The artist's love of the human figure has led her to paint subject matter of the street scene, the café, markets, fishermen, dancers, historical figures and portraiture

James Calk -Rhythm and Hues 9/26 – 12/15/19

Georgetown-SC artist James Calk grew up in Saluda, SC, and attended Newberry College (Newberry, SC). He has received numerous awards, and his work has been exhibited widely and collected by many. Calk paints large-scale, abstract landscapes in oil filled with thick applications of paint.

Rhythm and Hues features an assortment of Calk's abstract landscapes and still-lifes, in addition to a sampling of semi-abstracted paintings from his "tonalist" period, which exhibit the artist's ability to work with a minimal palette.

Featuring 11 works of art of varying sizes and media from the Museum's Permanent Collection, *Bordering on Abstraction* is an exhibition of works that do just that: border the line between abstraction and representational or figurative art.
