The Myrtle Beach Art Museum AMERICAN SOCIETY OF MARINE ARTISTS 18TH NATIONAL EXHIBITION

January 16 - April 17, 2021

Marine art is a genre that depicts maritime activities, inshore and harbor scenes, naval scenes, ship portraits, waterscapes and marine wildlife. Marine art took root as its own genre during the Dutch Golden Age of the 17th century, when artists began to make their careers by specializing in naval and trade ship portraits and scenes. Many of the conventions of the Dutch tradition of marine painting are still practiced today. The Romantic period of the 1900s ushered in the dawn of the popularity of the seascape, making waterscapes absent of vessels common for the first time. European marine artists, who came to America, helped establish this genre in prosperous port cities, including Boston, New York and Salem.

The American Society of Marine Artists is a nonprofit organization dedicated to the promotion of marine art and maritime history, with a focus on education and the exchange of ideas among artists, collectors, educators, historians and students. Since its founding in 1978, the ASMA has presented its prestigious national exhibition biennially. Featuring 110 paintings, drawings and sculptures representing the very best in marine art, this highly sought-after exhibition is touring museums throughout the United States, and the Art Museum is proud to be one of those venues.

The 24th Annual Waccamaw Arts & Crafts Guild Juried Show

April 29th - May 27th, 2021

The entry deadline has passed and I am sending off the entries to be juried.

I am trying to make this year somewhat special, so be sure to read below. It is not a complete loss this year.

IMPORTANT INFORMATION:

We will, once again, face some challenges with the Covid 19 virus. We will NOT have a normal reception, but we will have awards and our art will be on display at the museum for about a month.

Here is the important part:

On April 29th the judge, Dee Beard Dean, will be at the museum in the morning to do the judging of the show. We should have the results by noon, at which point I will start preparing awards, etc.

Between noon and 1:00 pm (I hope), I will call the winners of awards and ask them to appear at the museum *promptly* at 3:45 pm. This will not be open to friends, family or others due to Covid issues. We will start giving awards and filming at 4:00 pm. The idea is to give the artists time to get to the museum and dress properly for the occasion.

The winners will be allowed to come in to the museum and participate in a different type of award ceremony. Each artist will be filmed standing with the artwork and the judge. The award will be presented and the judge will talk about the art and why it won an award. This video will be posted on our website for all to see.

Again, this small ceremony will be for the artists only. I wish we could, once again, have a reception with refreshments and a large crowd, but Covid 19 is still somewhat of a problem. The good news is that the video will be available on the web for all to see.

There will still be prizes, and the show, at the museum, is open to anyone who wishes to see the artwork in person (for which, there is no substitute). This is going to be a great show. The artwork submitted looks great.

We ended up with 135 pieces of art submitted, and 80-85 of those will be accepted. Competition will be tough, and everyone who makes it into the show will know that their work is really special. For the rest of you, it will be unfortunate because some good artwork may not make it into the show. We all work hard and we should be proud of ourselves for making the effort. There's always next year ,.....I have told myself that, more than a few times, in the past!

Thanks to all who "took the plunge" and submitted art to the show. Good luck to all of you.
