APRIL VIDEO PRESENTATIONS

The works selected for the month of April 2021 include the *St. Peter's Basilica Pietà* and the *Rondanini Pietà*. Both works were created by the highly skilled and influential artist, Michelangelo Buonarroti. Michelangelo was born on March 6, 1475 in Caprese, Republic of Florence and passed on February 18, 1564 in the Papal States of Rome.

The works were created during two very different periods of time in Michelangelo's life. The *St. Peter's Basilica Pietà* was completed in 1498-1499 at the youthful age of 23 -24. It is located in St. Peter's Basilica, within the Vatican, Rome. The *Rondanini Pietà*, Michelangelo's final work, was being worked and re-worked by the artist at the age of 89, a mere six days before his death. The *Rondanini Pietà* is now located in the Sforza Castle in Milan, Italy. Upon closer examination and study – the works are, at the same time similar, yet, very, very different from each other.

It is my hope that whatever your position regarding religious imagery may be, that through the presented online content, you will learn something new, gain a deeper appreciation towards this highly skilled and gifted artist, marvel at the powerful works he created, and be inspired by the dedication and commitment to his craft practiced over a lifetime. Enjoy!

The videos in **PART I** focus on the *St. Peter's Basilica Pietà* and the videos in **PART II** focus, primarily, on the *Rondanini Pietà*. And, there are a few BONUS VIDEOs, which should add some helpful how-to and where content.

IMPORTANT INFORMATION:

MONDAY, APRIL 19TH ALL ACCEPTED ART IS TO BE DROPPED OFF AT THE MUSEUM BETWEEN THE HOURS OF 9:00 AM AND

12:00 NOON. This is necessary, though it may be inconvenient for some of you. If you can't deliver during those hours, get someone to do it for you. This is the only time that we will take in art for the show.

We will, once again, face some challenges with the Covid 19 virus. We will NOT have a normal reception, but we will have awards and our art will be on display at the museum for about a month.

Here is the important part: On April 29th the judge, Dee Beard Dean, will be at the museum in the morning to do the judging of the show. We should have the results by noon, at which point I will start preparing awards, etc.

Between noon and 1:00 pm (I hope), I will call the winners of awards and ask them to appear at the museum promptly at 3:45 pm. This will not be open to friends, family or others due to Covid issues. We will start giving awards and filming at 4:00 pm. The idea is to give the artists time to get to the museum and dress properly for the occasion.

The winners will be allowed to come in to the museum and participate in a different type of award ceremony. Each artist will be filmed standing with the artwork and the judge. The award will be presented and the judge will talk about the art and why it won an award. This video will be posted on our website for all to see.

Again, this small ceremony will be for the artists only. I wish we could, once again, have a reception with refreshments and a large crowd, but Covid 19 is still somewhat of a problem. The good news is that the video will be available on the web for all to see.

There will still be prizes, and the show, at the museum, is open to anyone who wishes to see the artwork in person (for which, there is no substitute). This is going to be a great show.
