Our program will be given by Kate Johnson, a Guild member.



Kate Johnson has been making soap for 12 years after retiring from 2 "real jobs." She was a Medical Technologist and then a Licensed Professional Counselor. Her mom kept asking her why she was still in school.

She was always interested in the arts and met Clay Johnson at the Pennsylvania Academy of the Fine Arts in Philadelphia. He taught her about color, painting and design. She went through several different crafts and hit upon soap making and got stuck there when she realized she could combine color, design and fragrance all at the same time.

In the talk, Kate will describe the different ways of making soap in a nutshell, and how her Shea Butter and Glycerin soap evolved to more



sophisticated designs, colors, etc. Basically she likes to go in her studio and play "what if I did this or that". This

is the best job she has ever had.

FEBRUARY ONLINE VIDEO PRESENTATIONS Larry Bunch

Let's get started. The Online Video Presentations for the month of February have to do with printmaking and related content. Each presentation has been selected to inform and inspire by highlighting some of the unique qualities and distinct differences regarding the printmaking processes of etching, drypoint, lithography, serigraphy, relief printing, and monoprints. With that said, in researching and deciding on which videos seem to best address the varied content, while, at the same time, endeavoring to avoid sweeping content-burn-out among the readership, I decided that it may be best to separate and distribute the content over both the February and the March newsletters.

The videos selected for February focused on printmaking content having to do with the processes of etching, drypoint, aquaprint, mezzoprint, and lithography. For the month of March, the videos will focus on printmaking content having to do with relief printing, serigraphy, and monoprints.

Within both months there is a wide range of videos. Some of the videos have been selected to "set the stage" by offering informative insight into biographical context and historical printmakingrelated content. There are also videos which provide opportunities-of-observation into the very technical spaces and labor-intensive operations of printmakers' workshops where artists of varying skillsets proficiently utilize a range of specific tools and materials while describing and demonstrating complex methods and techniques. And, there are videos that present the work of highly skilled and noteworthy artists, both contemporary and past, whose creative works exemplify the finest qualities of printmaking imagery.

As always, it is my hope that you find this content informative, inspiring, and beneficial. Enjoy!

SYNCHRONICITY | ALICE

BALLARD + BRIAN RUTENBERG

January 15 – April 16, 2022

The rich beauty and wonder of the South Carolina landscape permeate the work of ceramist Alice Ballard (b. 1945 Florence, SC) and painter Brian Rutenberg (b. 1965, Myrtle Beach, SC), who both share a deep connection with and great love of our region's natural surroundings. Synchronicity is a nod not only to this thematic tie that harmonizes their markedly different art forms, but perhaps even more so to the serendipitous connections - both geographical and philosophical - that the artists continue to discover about the paths their lives and work have taken. Rutenberg remarks: "Synchronicity is when two people respond to one another from two different vantage points to make one expression. It is that personal response to nature that the viewer will

come away with. We do it in very different ways: my work is 2D and filled with saturated color; Alice's is 3D with a focus on value/monochromatism. We land in the same place, but in the middle, we diverge. It's that place in the middle where viewers will have the biggest takeaway with their experience."
