The May meeting was held on Saturday, May 7th at the Myrtle Beach Art Museum. This is a program we always look forward to. Jaime Franklin brought students from the Academy of Art, Science and Technology to show their artistic accomplishments.

As is usually the case, the presentations were very interesting. Jaime also led us all on a tour of the high school show on the second floor of the museum. That show was wonderful.

We had our June Board of Directors meeting Saturday, June 4th, at which time we awarded a \$1,000 grant to Loris Middle School Teacher, Meredith Cravin, to fund her project, "Warm as Wool" for the students at Loris Middle School.



We also presented a \$1,000 grant to Jamie Franklin from the Academy of Arts, Science and Technology. That grant will cover expenses for "Advanced Art Major Senior Exhibitions of Mastery" by her senior students. These projects are complex and materials can be quite expensive.



Both groups will do a presentation next year, in May, which will show us the end result of the work done.

We believe these grants are a wonderful way to give back to the community and to help our local students learn new skills and enhance their creativity.

THE WORLD OF FRIDA

June 18 - September 24, 2022

One of the most well-known female painters in the history of art is the fiercely brave and passionate Mexican painter Frida Kahlo (1907 - 1954), who is, today, a shining example of empowerment, beauty and determination. Her name alone conjures her self-image in our minds, as her numerous self-portraits in which her unibrow is her most discerning feature are considered iconic examples of her work. As with many artists that have come before and after Frida, her work did not receive critical acclaim until a couple of decades after her death. It was in the late 1970s that art historians and political activists began to rediscover and examine her work, which eventually led to Frida becoming a champion for the Chicana, feminist and LGBQT activist movements. It is Frida's fearless expression of honest individuality and the human condition that has inspired the 114 works of

art in a variety of media by 94 artists from around the world in the Art Museum's exciting summer exhibition *The World of Frida*, which was organized by The Bedford Gallery at the Lesher Center for the Arts in Walnut Creek, CA, and has been traveling the country since 2018. The Art Museum is proud to be one of the last venues to host the traveling exhibition, particularly during this very special year, 2022 – the Art Museum's 25th anniversary.

The opening day ceremony will be on June 18th from 11:30-2:30pm at the Art Museum. It will be family-friendly and include tin art and skeletons kids art workshops, self-portrait and flower-crown workshops for adults, loteria, games, community Frida mural, face painting, authentic Mexican food, mariachi, exhibit tours in English and Spanish, films, selfie station, and a costume contest.
