Jeremy R. Brooks was born in Detroit, MI in 1979. He received his B.F.A. from Grand Valley State University & M.F.A. from Alfred University. Jeremy has balanced his career between working as an artist & teaching in academia. Some of his honors include receiving the emerging artist award from the National Council on Education for the Ceramic Arts (NCECA), being selected as a guest of honor at the XXIst International Biennial of Vallauris, France, & being selected as a finalist for the 2017 Elizabeth R. Raphael Founder's Prize. Jeremy is currently an Assistant Professor of Ceramics at Coastal Carolina University and resides in Conway, SC.

### Myrtle Beach Art Museum NATALIE DAISE – THE GREENS IN MY GARDEN

October 4 – December 31, 2022

Best known as "Ms. Natalie" on Nick Jr.'s award-winning television program, *Gullah Gullah Island*, Daise has developed and facilitated interactive learning experiences

for educators, students and others for more than 30 years. She earned a BA degree from Vermont College in 1992 and a MA in Creativity Studies in 2014. Awards and nominations include the 1996 South Carolina Order of the Palmetto, the state's highest honor, and the 1997 State of South Carolina Folk Heritage Award, given for lifetime achievement and excellence in folk art that has enriched the lives of the people in their community and state, as well as a 2017 Merit Award for her painting, Free Your Mind - Redux, in Lake City, SC's ARTFields competition. Natalie Daise: The Greens in My Garden features recent paintings comprised of striking oil-and-metal-leaf portraits of both family members and friends, adorned with sweetgrass-woven jewelry, traditional African-patterned clothing and bright halos, all teeming with the symbolic roots of her Gullah upbringing – collard greens and garden flowers.

### JONATHAN GREEN – EMBRACING GULLAH SPIRIT October 13 – December 31, 2022

Regarded as one of the most important painters of the American South – in particular that of the South Carolina Gullah community - Charleston-based painter Jonathan Green (b. 1955, Gardens Corner, SC) is recognized as an iconic proponent of the arts, especially along our stretch of coast. Green's sweeping, dreamy Lowcountry vistas filled with bright and boldly patterned dressed figures in striking color combinations that hearken back to their West African roots have become immediately recognizable as painted by the artist's hand. A forty-year career has yielded an abundance of these highly sought-after paintings that fill two volumes of art books, serve as theater backdrops and inspire

costumes for ballets and musicals and illustrate children's books. The Art Museum is proud to boast that it houses 22 of Green's works in its permanent collection, affording it the second largest museum collection of his work in the world

#### South Caroline State Museum August 27<sup>th</sup> – January 8<sup>th</sup>, 2022

This show, in Columbia, is a national show put on by the South Carolina Watermedia Society. This should be a great show so you might want to check it out.
