Monthly Meeting

There will be a meeting Saturday, February 4, 2023 from 10:00 am until noon at the Myrtle Beach Art Museum, in the second-floor classroom. We will have a brief meeting and then have the program by Liz Blood.

Liz will present a program on lampwork glass.

Lampworking is a process that uses an oxygen and propane torch to melt Italian glass around a stainless-steel mandrel. Liz melts the glass rods to make unique and interesting color combinations that form the leaves, vines, and flowers. Her art glass beads and sculpture capture the diverse forms and

shapes found in nature. Her jewelry and beads have been displayed in fine art galleries throughout the United States, and highlighted in local and national publications. Examples of her work below. It should be very interesting and fun for all.



Our last program was presented by Connie Huddle in the pottery studio on the ground floor of the Art Museum. It was a lot of fun and very interesting. Myrtle Beach Art Museum RANDI REISS-MCCORMACK WONDERLUST

January 10 – April 16, 2023

Originally from Boston, MA, Randi Reiss-McCormack currently lives and works as a professional artist in Baltimore, MD. Reiss-McCormack focuses her art primarily on painting, printmaking and mixed-media works. She is currently interested in the play between experiments in printmaking, textiles and painting and how they inform and influence one another.

The work in *Wonderlust* was created over the past three years and veers between the recognizable and the abstract. The imagery is derived from the physicality of the world but is guided by the subconscious. Reiss-McCormack explores how abstraction gives form to things residing in and imprinted on our subconscious. Working in a wide range of media, moving from textile and printmaking to painting and mixed media, the artist uses the constraints of each medium to intercede on one another. The structure for these latest works relies heavily on the imprint of organic shapes and forms derived from nature.

JENNIFER YORK – ESTUARY BLUES

January 19 - April 16, 2023

Jennifer York is a lifelong artist and explorer. In 2018-19, York traveled to a dozen countries for four monthlong international art residencies, where she filled sketchbooks with observational drawings and created a series of collapsible carousel pop-up book sculptures that fit in her carry-on suitcase. She then relocated to the tidal marshlands near Folly Beach, SC, in March 2020. As an avid runner during the COVID-19 pandemic, York found old suitcases and mirrors on the side of the road and saw them as creative vessels in which to build wondrous new scenes of

intricate cut paper – a natural development from the carousel book structures. She continued to develop this body of work as a 2021 Gibbes Museum of Art (Charleston, SC) Visiting Artist. *Estuary Blues* encompasses York's work and life since moving to the South Carolina coast.
