LIFTING BLACK VOICES / THE RHODES COLLECTION OF AFRICAN-AMERICAN ART June 13th – September 10th, 2023

This summer, experience the vibrant and expressive African-American art collection of Dr. and Mrs. Harold M. Rhodes, III. Although their collecting began in 1991, Dr. Rhodes explains that his interest in art has followed him all his life. "To me, art ignites the imagination and influences the decisions we make....It affects each one of us differently, and that is the beauty of art," says Rhodes. Work by such prominent artists as Arianne King Comer, James Denmark, Tom Feelings, Tyrone Geter, Jonathan Green, Philip Simmons and Leo Twiggs will fill our galleries. All of the artists represented are either native to or spent a significant time in their career working in South Carolina. The 80 selections from the Rhodes Collection range from paintings and sculpture to quilts, batiks and collage and are representative of the black Carolinian experience, from the dark times of enslavement and discrimination to those celebrating ancestry, faith, life, love, perseverance and heritage.

## THE STICK BY CLAY RICE

### June 6th – September 3rd, 2023

Developed by nationally-known silhouette artist Clay Rice and The South Carolina State Museum, *The Stick* traveling exhibition is based on the artist's children's book of the same name. The Stick is about a young boy, who embarks on an exciting life journey after finding a very special stick that sparks his creativity. "The Stick is a poignant and heartfelt oath to the power of imagination," says Rice. With original illustrations by Rice, as well as dramatic gallery backdrops by local set designer Tim Harvey, The Stick will come to life inside our Museum walls. This familyfriendly exhibition invites all ages to immerse themselves in the elegant black-and-white world of Rice's silhouettes accentuated by a fun and colorful gallery experience filled with kids' costumes, photo-ops and a cozy reading nook.

## One More Thing -

When I first announced our effort to establish an oil painting workshop, I had a dozen artists contact me immediately, At that time we had few details, and did not know where we could get a venue. As details emerged, it became clear that the cost of a one-day event for a dozen students would be about \$140 each. All workshops have a cost and, in this case, that is the best that we can do. I hope that we can get this workshop, and others, for our members. It will depend upon the level of interest. So far, some have backed out due to the cost, scheduling conflicts, etc. We will know by June 30<sup>th</sup> if we have enough artists to make it work.

You may have noticed that we now have dates for the Member's Judged Show on October. For that show each member artist may enter (up to) 2 artworks. Art that was not accepted into the Juried Show this year would be eligible. Of course, anything that was actually in a previous show is not eligible. So, let's all create some great art for the Member Show.

The development of the downtown Arts & Innovation District will take some time, but there are already efforts to bring events into that area. We want to become part of that project and participate in those events. One thing that is happening now are plein air painting opportunities at Nance Plaza. There are art walks on the first Friday of each month going into the fall. Our artists can go down there from 6:00 to 8:00 pm and set up. It could be a great opportunity to sell some art and get noticed. I am trying to gather more information on how to participate, where we can set up, and what may be required. I will send out information when I can get it. We need to get active in the district.
