June 13th - September 10th, 2023

This summer, experience the vibrant and expressive African-American art collection of Dr. and Mrs. Harold M. Rhodes, III. Although their collecting began in 1991, Dr. Rhodes explains that his interest in art has followed him all his life. Work by such prominent artists as Arianne King Comer, James Denmark, Tom Feelings, Tyrone Geter, Jonathan Green, Philip Simmons and Leo Twiggs will fill our galleries. All of the artists represented are either native to or spent a significant time in their career working in South Carolina.

Developed by nationally-known silhouette artist Clay Rice and The South Carolina State Museum, *The Stick* traveling exhibition is based on the artist's children's book of the same name.
