Art in the Park

This past weekend was a test for the artists who participate in Art in the Park and other outdoor events. Mother Nature also attends these events. This past weekend Saturday was extremely hot and humid which caused some to feel uncomfortable. Saturday night, however, was tragic for some. Strong storms with gusty winds caused major damage to about a third of the tents and many artists lost their product. It was a mess!

We stress to artists participating in these events that they should take every precaution to make their tents secure and resistant to wind. Even a high-quality tent can sustain damage. Corners should be adequately weighted (about 40-50lbs/corner). Sides should go to the ground and there should be a seal between sides and roof. If you keep the wind out with adequate weight, all should go well. Tom
