My name is Abby Nelson, and I've spent most of my life immersed in outdoor media as a producer and social media marketer. I've always had a passion for the outdoors, and in 2015, I picked up my first chainsaw, initially treating it as a hobby. Over the years, I've had the privilege of learning from some incredible mentors who have guided me along the way. Their wisdom, combined with my love for nature, has shaped my journey from a casual interest to a deep-seated passion. Drawing inspiration from animals and landscape scenes, I've transitioned into considering myself a chainsaw artist in the past couple of years. I've always believed that you don't have to be good at something to enjoy it; sometimes, the joy is in the

process itself. In the best-case scenario, you might even get good at it along the way. This mindset has allowed me to embrace the craft fully, and it's been a rewarding experience to see my skills evolve with each new carving.

2024 Judged Member Show

The prospectus is out and the website is available for your entries. The entry fee is \$35 for 2 entries and we have a wonderful judge who will give out ribbons and prize money. Get to work and create some great art. We will again be at the Seacoast Artist Gallery. Many of you will remember our Judge, John Hull. I am looking forward to

seeing him again, and a lot of great works from our artists.

This year the prize money is as follows:

Best in Show – 500 2nd Place - 400 3rd Place - 300 6 Henerable Mentions 50

6 Honorable Mentions 50 (each)

The deadline for entries is September 30th so be sure to get your entry in on time.

Incidentally, this will be an opportunity for everyone to meet our new Show & Communications Director, Leslie Danklefs. She is currently working with me, preparing to take over the job.

Mini Masterpiece Fund Raiser

Again, this year we will have our Mini Masterpiece sale to raise money for our projects. Guild members are invited to submit original 2D or 3D art works. You do not have to be in the Member Show to participate. All media are accepted. Each art work must not exceed 12 inches in any direction.

- The 12" maximum includes framing, matting, pedestals and bases. Matted originals are accepted, but they must be enclosed in a protective sleeve.
- All 2D art must be wired and ready to hang (except for matted pieces). Small easels may be used for very small works; however, the size restriction applies to the easel as well.
- 3D pieces must be ready to display. If needed please provide the base or pedestal for sale with the art work. Again, the size restriction applies.
- each item must be labeled with the artist name, the title of the piece, medium and price.

50% of each sale will benefit the Guild's education programs and 50% goes to the artist. The Mini Masterpieces will be sold in a separate specified area of the Seacoast Artists Gallery during the Member's Judged Show. The minis are not part of the Member's Judged Show.

Participating artists must deliver their art work(s) to the Seacoast Artists Gallery on October 16th, 2023 between the hours of 8:00 am and 12:00 noon. Pickup must be done on October 29th, from 8:00 am -12:00 noon as the doors are locked at noon. You must be sure to deliver and pick up your art on time as we do not have the ability to store art.

Shows & Exhibits

Paul Yanko:
Primary Structures
Myrtle Beach Art Museum
September 12th - February 23rd, 2025



Employing vast color palettes, juxtaposing architectural with organic shapes and creating relief-like surfaces by varying paint densities, abstract painter Paul Yanko (b. 1968, Youngstown, OH) of Greenville, SC, has developed and mastered a masking technique that affords his compositions both flat and illusionistic views. The artist encourages the viewer to consider his interest in reconciling two distinct components of painting: rigorously developed configurations of shape and less controlled methods of paint application based on pouring. Over the course of his career, Yanko has found harmony in these two seemingly contradictory methods. Like the yin and yang of ancient Chinese philosophy, the two opposing qualities are actually complementary and create balance. His bright and color-packed paintings are meticulously built in layers of acrylic paint mixed with various mediums over collaged surfaces – the end result only truly appreciated in person, where one can observe the fluctuating terrain of their surfaces. Primary Structures presents an exceptional selection of work in Yanko's primary medium - painting - as well as a handful of monotypes, a medium that the artist has explored in several series.

South Carolina Watermedia Society 47th Annual National Exhibition Myrtle Beach Art Museum October 3rd – December 29th, 2024

The South Carolina Watermedia Society presents its most competitive exhibition in years. With nearly 180 entries, juror Ken Call meticulously curated a collection of 58 pieces that represent artists from coast to coast. The collection focuses heavily on Southeastern artists, particularly those residing in Georgia, North Carolina and – of course – South Carolina. With works ranging from abstract to stark realism, the breadth of watermedia is expounded, explored and enriched through the South Carolina Watermedia Society's 47th Annual National Exhibition.

Gallery Search

For years now we have been looking for an appropriate space that we could call home. We have looked at numerous properties over the years, but none of them worked for our purposes. We learned from these efforts that any prospective property must be in a good location, be adequate in size and that any property will probably require a lot of work to convert it for our needs.

When a plan for the downtown Art and Innovation District in Myrtle Beach was announced, we became energized and began looking at properties in the area back in about 2022. So far, several possibilities have been reviewed, but nothing has worked out yet.

We are asking all of our members to be alert to any potential properties that may become available and let us know what they are, where they are and contact information if known.

Any help will be appreciated. We need to assure that the Guild moves forward and continues to serve the art community in the Grand Strand area.

Call for Artists

The Island Arts Council for Carolina and Kure Beaches is leading a public sculpture project, Venus Flytrap on Parade, that will install 10 to 15 artist-painted statues around our island. The statues will be installed March 2025 for the Carolina Beach Centennial Celebration.

We are seeking regional artists to participate in the event. Artists will be asked to submit designs to embellish, decorate, or paint fiberglass statues for the exhibition. Designs will be selected based upon creativity, craftsmanship, use of materials, the ability to appeal to all ages, sustainability and durability. Participating artists will receive a stipend and a portion of final sales. When things happen... June – August submit proposals, May to October painting, November to January 2025 prep for installation, February statues installed, March – September statues on display, October – November auction.
